An exciting Summer of Printmaking awaits! This is the opportunity for you to learn everything about printmaking that you have been wanting to know, or improve on a favorite technique, and schedule it at a time that best fits your busy days.

No experience is required to get you started, and experienced artists can proceed at a comfortable pace. Every class size is limited to allow all students some "elbow room" for working. Professional quality waterbased inks will be used in all classes, with non-toxic methods and materials.

While you are taking a class, each Friday is designated a *Free Day*, where you can finish a project, working on your own; plus additional days may be available, fee-reduced, to allow you to continue your printmaking practice. During *Free Day* sessions you will be responsible for cleaning up after yourself.

MONOTYPE: MONDAYS & WEDNESDAYS

Starting June 18 through August 1 Choose as many Mon/Weds weeks as you like. \$100 a week, All supplies are included. (No class July 4th, make-up TBA)

Every Monday some Monotype techniques will be introduced with complete demos, at least two different ones each week. *See the Technique Description for more information.* You can start on any Monday, and work on your own prints after the demos and continue your printing on Wednesday and *Free Days.*

Progess at your own pace with expert assistance when needed. Additional tips will be discussed at every session to help you learn new approaches and special skills in printmaking. **INTAGLIO 1:** TUESDAYS & THURSDAYS Starting June 19 through August 2 Choose as many Tues/Thurs weeks as you like. \$100 a week, All supplies are included.

Every Tuesday a Contemporary Intaglio technique will be introduced with a complete demo, a different one every week. These techniques are chemical-free, using inexpensive materials. *See the Technique Description for more information*.

You can begin on any Tuesday, and work on your own prints after the demo and continue your printing on Wednesday and *Free Days*.

MONOTYPE 1

Sat./Sun., June 23 & 24

Two day introductory session with several Monotype techniques and lots of printmaking time. No one goes home empty handed!

MONOTYPE 2

Sat./Sun., June 30 & July 1

Two day intensive with more advanced demos, for those who are ready to move on from Monotype 1, and intermediate/advanced printmakers who already have some experience with monotypes and water based inks.

INTAGLIO

2 Sundays, July 8 & July 15

Two day intensive with demos of several techniques, and lots of press time.

Divided into 2 Sunday sessions to allow time to complete the platemaking during the week. Students may work at home or use the studio to continue working on them, TBA; no proof printing during these extra free work sessions except by arrangement.

RELIEF 1:

2 Saturdays, July 7 & 14

Two day intensive, working with the choice of linoleum or wood blocks.

Demos will start with simple, inexpensive materials to understand the process of developing layered multicolored images before moving on to the linoleum or wood. A computer may be used to help prepare the images before cutting the blocks.

This workshop is divided into 2 Saturday sessions to allow time to cut the blocks during the week. Students may work at home or use the studio to continue working on them, TBA; no proof printing during these extra free work sessions except by arrangement.

Technique Descriptions

MONOTYPE — Monotypes are one-of-a-kind unique prints that cannot be duplicated. Unlike printmaking methods that produce a printing plate with permanent grooves and marks that will hold ink, the Monotype plate is perfectly smooth and all you have to do is apply inks to the surface. Lessons include many options to explore, and Monotype can easily be combined with other techniques to add special interest.

INTAGLIO — Intaglio is one of the most revered printmaking methods because the plates are capable of being re-inked so the artist can make multiple copies of an image. Since Watermark Press features water based inks and avoids dangerous acids and other chemicals there are several traditional techniques that are not used

A Deposit of 50% of Workshop/Class Fee is due with registration. The Balance of the class fee is due by start of first class. Optional and/or required materials list will be forwarded upon confirmation of registration. here, but there are many safe options in this category, that imitate the styles of traditional intaglio. One of the major benefits is a big savings in cost of materials.

Some of these techniques include: Drypoint, Silk Aquatint, Collagraph and Carborundum.

RELIEF — The oldest printmaking technique recognized worldwide, Relief offers different ways of creating prints, and many contemporary artists continue to work in this simplistic medium. We begin experimenting with inexpensive materials then progress to wood blocks or linoleum. Relief prints can be made by hand rubbing, running the plate and paper through an etching press or setting up multiple blocks on a letterpress machine, which enables multi color layered prints to be easily executed in perfect registration.
